- 1. **Purpose**: What is the character's main purpose? What other goals or objectives does the character hope to accomplish?
- 2. **Question**: What is the key question or problem that character is addressing?
- 3. **Information**: What information is the character using to reason through this issue? What other information or data does the character need?
- 4. **Conclusions**: What are the character's major conclusions? What solutions are being offered?
- 5. **Concepts**: What are the main concepts the reasoning depends on? How does the character understand those concepts?
- 6. Assumptions: What are the main assumptions the character is making in his reasoning?
- 7. **Implications and Consequences**: What are some of the unforeseen consequences of this line of reasoning?
- 8. **Point of View**: From what point of view is the character addressing this question? What other points of view are necessary to understand this piece of reasoning?
- 9. Context: What circumstances led up to the issue and to this character's reasoning?
- 10. **Alternatives**: What alternatives are there to the character's reasoning?
